

Freelance Arts Fabricator - Job Description

ABOUT THE HERD

The Herd brings children and families together in playful spaces to share exceptional arts experiences. We play alongside children to create shows, installations, workshops and events that celebrate, interrogate and nurture the joy of childhood. We believe in the transformational power of family arts and create experiences that children and adults can share together. Our vision is for a society that respects children and the importance of their play. By creating high quality theatre and play experiences for young audiences we show children that they are valued.

We are a company deeply invested in our home city of Hull, with a growing, nationally significant, output. We are passionate about reaching children and families who are excluded from the arts, with a focus on working class people and disabled people.

Since 2016 The Herd have reached a national audience of over 78,000 people, and worked directly with over 2000 children and young people. We produce high quality early years theatre, made with children, including commissions from Hull Truck and transfers to The Royal Exchange.

In 2023 we delivered a commission for The Southbank Centre in London - REPLAY, a play installation made from 100% recycled materials that reached 15,000 people. REPLAY has been programmed to return to The Southbank Centre January - June 2025 and then head to Bradford for their City of Culture programme in Autumn 2025.

Our One Day Play programme annually gives 600+ children in Hull the opportunity to write, design and perform their own show in a professional theatre. We run regular creative play sessions in libraries, schools, community centres, and our own

playspace - a shop unit in Princes Quay Shopping Centre, Hull.

ROLE INFO

We are recruiting a pool of Arts Fabricators based in Hull and the surrounding area for our upcoming project REPLAY. We'll be using waste, scrap and spare material gathered from factories, Theatre shows, fashion shoots etc and repurposing them for play materials for the exhibition REPLAY.

By 'Arts Fabricator' we mean a professional who works with artists and designers to create and preserve artworks. In our instance these artworks are the objects and set pieces in our play exhibition.

They Fabricator will be responsible for a variety of tasks, including:

- Able to work to Artists vision: Working alongside the project artists and production manager to assist in the realisation of the work.
- Varied skill set: We're interested in talking to people with experience in general making and/or people with specific skills in working with a range of materials. You might have experience or training in theatre design, prop making, sculpture, textiles, carpentry, painting, or something completely different.
- Materials knowledge: Selecting and preparing materials to achieve specific artistic effects
- Precision and attention to detail: Ensuring that items created to the highest standards
- Preservation and conservation: Ensuring that items are properly cared for, cleaned and maintained over time

Although this call out is currently for one specific project, we're always in need of local fabricators with these skill sets so please get in touch even if you are not available the dates mentioned below.

WHAT EXPERIENCE DO I NEED?

ESSENTIAL

- Diverse practical skills and knowledge of making in your medium.
- Experience in using a wide range of mediums, experience working with textiles, upholstery and carpentry is preferable.
- Knowledge of materials
- Ability to use scissors, staple gun and other hand tools
- Ability to clean materials
- Ability to work with a team
- Has attention to detail and good communication skills
- A resourceful maker with creative, positive, open outlooks
